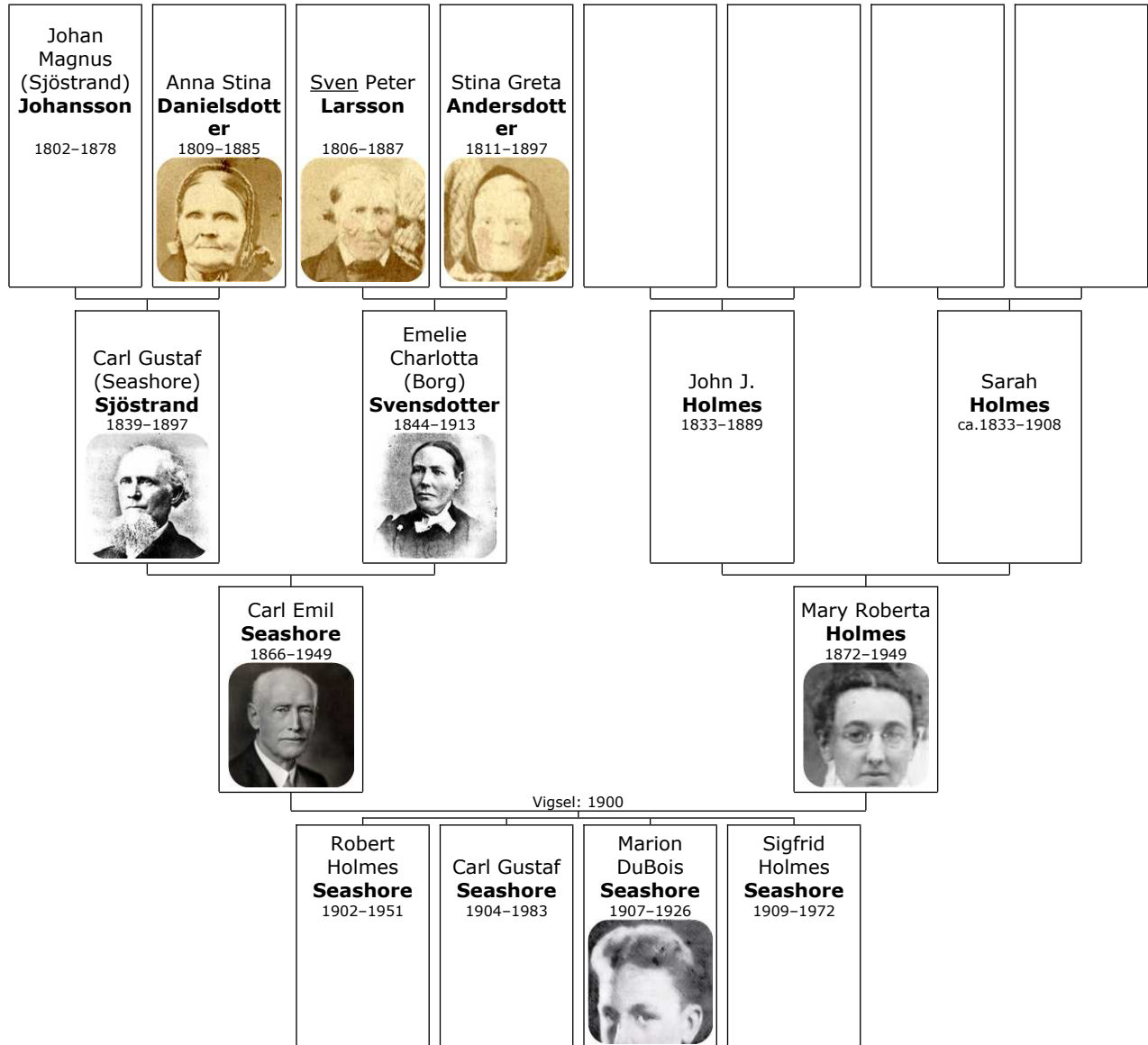

Carl Emil dog i Nez Perce, Idaho, USA den 16 oktober 1949 vid en ålder av 83 år.

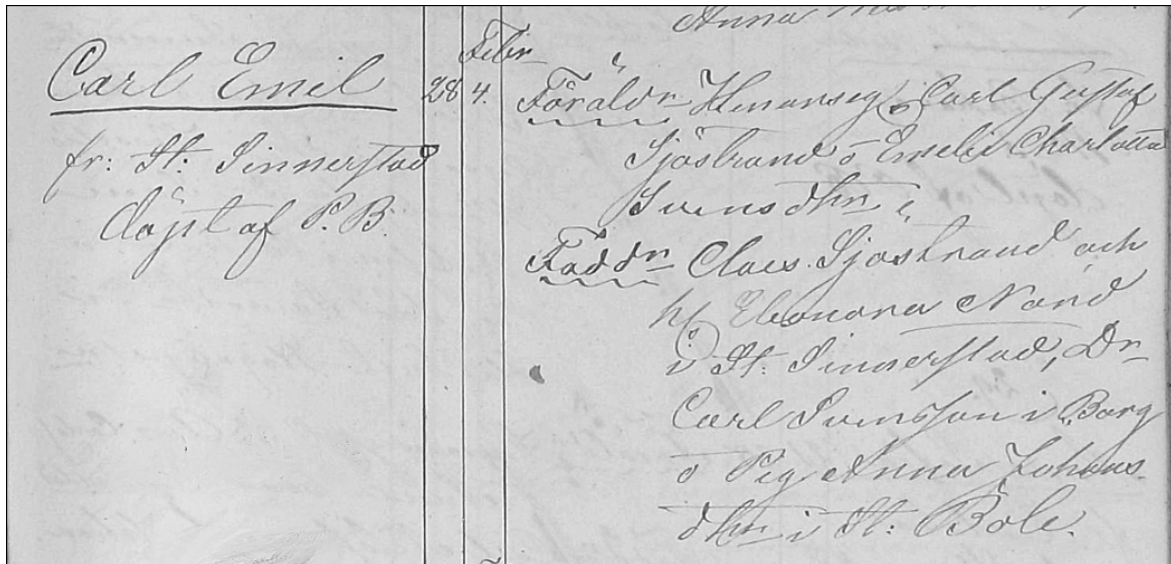

## Gör det svenska namnet heder.

På besök i sin fädernebygd, Dayton, Iowa, vistas nu professor C. E. Seashore, stadd på resa från Yale universitetet till statsuniversitetet i Iowa City, Iowa. Dr. Seashore är född af svenska föräldrar å en farm nära Dayton. Hans fader, mr Sjöstrand, afled för en kort tid sedan. Dr. Seashore har, säger en bytestidning, på ett erkännansvärdt sätt gjort en god början med att häfda svens-

skarnes renommee här i landet. Efter att i Gustavus Adolphus College hafva gjort förberedande studier, som sedan fortsattes i Yale College, New Haven, Conn., promoverades han för två år sedan till filosofie doktor samt utnämndes derefter till biträdande lärare i filosofi. Den filosofiska professorsstolen i Iowas universitet i Iowa City var för kort tid sedan ledig och söktes af många kvalificerade och framstående amerikaner

samt af Dr. Seashore, hvilken också på grund af sin bemärkta kompetens blef antagen. Dr. Seashore har flera gånger hedrats med stipendium. Mycket mera kunde sägas om denne svensk-amerikanske filosof, i synnerhet med hänsyn till de många dragen af hans upphöjda karakter; men det sagda torde vara tillräckligt bevis att svenskarne här i lan-

det hafva förmågor, värda att taga vara på och odla.

Born in 1866. Gustavus Adolphus College, 1891; after 3 yrs. study at Yale, received the Doctrate and appointed Fellow in Philosophy and Asst. in Psychological Lab.; Instructorship in Philosophy, 1896, resigned to accept present position same year.

### MRS. SEASHORE RESIGNS TODAY FAVORS HOWELL

Mrs. Roberta H. Seashore, candidate for membership on the board of education, named by the non-partisan committee has tendered her resignation, withdrawing in favor of Attorney Ralph P. Howell, who had held the post before and is now in the concluding days of his service, as to his first term of three years duration.

Mr. Howell had chivalrously withdrawn his name from the committee's consideration at the time the nomination was made, as there was a desire to place a woman on the ticket. On the other hand, Mrs. Seashore supposed that the school would not run, and therefore she accepted the honor.

**She Endorses Judge Howell**

Today, in an interview with a representative of the Press-Citizen, Mrs. Seashore said:

"Since I have heard that Judge Howell, who has given such splendid service on the school board, can be induced to serve again, I am withdrawing my name from the school election ticket.

"I feel that Mr. Howell has served the city and the cause of education admirably and, if he will accept the nomination, he certainly ought to be re-elected.

"It is my sincere hope that no supporter of myself will make any effort, through a mistaken sense of friendship, to induce anybody to vote for me, as I am emphatically and positively withdrawing my name from the ticket."

**To Name Judge Howell?**

Judge Howell was urged today by many friends of himself and the city's schools, to reconsider and accept the nomination, if the non-partisan committee tenders it to him, and he informed his many communicants that he would do so, in that event.

The committee will meet this afternoon, and will name him.

In the event that a nomination is not made clearly enough to secure new tickets, then the following method or procedure is advised for the voters, who wish to cast their ballots for Judge Howell, as Mrs. Seashore urges.

Either write the judge's name on the now-printed ballot, that does not bear his name, and place a square in front of his name with an "X" in the square; or, if printed tickets are provided, bearing the judge's name, put an "X" in the square that will be printed before his name, and paste the sticker on the ticket—either over Mrs. Seashore's name or otherwise.

To vote for Thomas Farrell or Sam D. Whiting, (each voter has two choices) the elector may place a "C" in the square before either of those two names.

Mrs. Carl E. Seashore, rejoicing over the success, to achieve which she labored earnestly, together with her co-workers and their assistants, has tabulated some interesting figures concerning the securing of signatures and the numerical strength thereof. The grand total of names attached to the petitions is 1,721.

The block canvass, ward by ward, resulted as follows:

1st ward—249.
2nd ward—368
3rd ward—170.
4th ward—437
5th ward—369.

Total 1,571.

In addition the Woman's club, added 150 names.

Of the 4,400 registered voters of Iowa City, about 40 per cent expressed an opinion in favor of the World court.

Mrs. Frank A. Stromsten took the petition to Des Moines today to report to the state League of Women Voters.

## **Mrs R. Seashore Is Nominated for Iowa City School Board**

IOWA CITY, Ia., March 3.—(Special)—Iowa City's nonpartisan school committee has nominated a woman for the school board—Mrs Roberta Seashore, wife of Dr. Carl E. Seashore, dean of the graduate college and professor of philosophy and psychology. She will succeed Judge Ralph P. Howell, if she is elected. She will be, unless an independent ticket is filed, as Thomas Farrell, her running mate, is not likely to be beaten by the Democrats. Mrs Seashore is a Republican. If Sam D. Whiting, attorney, runs, he might win, although (or because) he is a Democrat, as is Farrell. William J. Weeber, a banker, was nominated for treasurer, to succeed the late Hon. George W. Koontz, Independent. Glenn Griffith, a treasurer pro tem, may also make the race.
