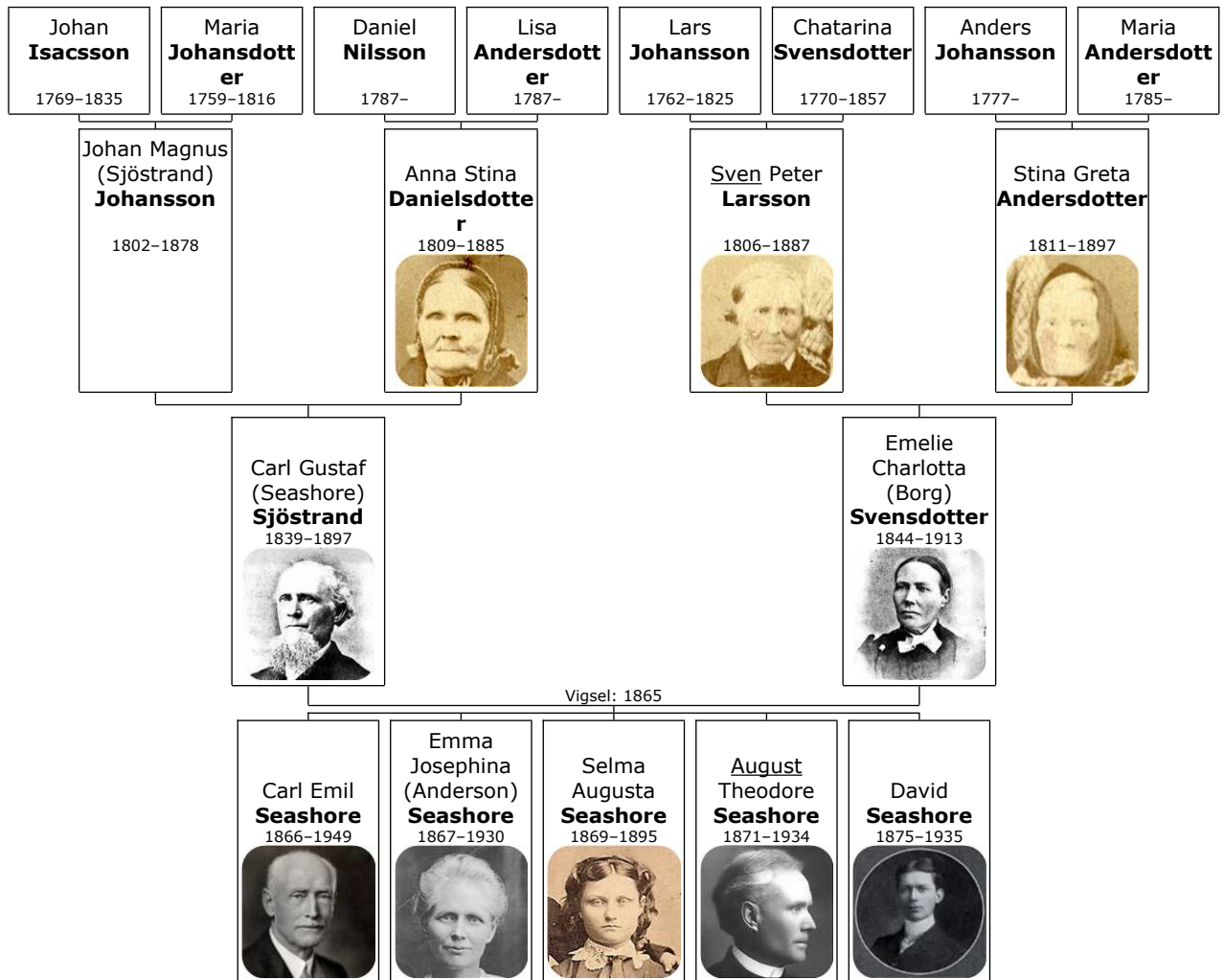


Selma Seashore



4. **Selma Augusta Seashore** (*Carl Gustaf (Seashore)¹ Sjöstrand*) föddes torsdagen den 9 september 1869 i Dayton, Boone, Iowa, USA. Hon var dotter till Carl Gustaf (Seashore) Sjöstrand (1) och Emelie Charlotta (Borg) Svensdotter.

OBITUARY

DIED - At her father's home in Grant township, Boone county, August 20, 1895, Selma Augusta Seashore, aged 25 years, 11 months, 11 days.

She was born in Boone county, Iowa, September 9, 1869. She got her first education in the country schools where she was always at the head of her classes. At the age of 17 she entered Gustavus Adolphus College, attending three terms. Her time since she left school has been employed in teaching Swedish and English schools.

She was a prominent member of the Lutheran church where she took great interest in the work of Sunday School and Young People's Society. Her heart ached with longing to enlighten and elevate the minds of the young.

She was loved by all with whom she came in contact for her kindly disposition to do good and help everybody. She has always been ambitious to attain good results. She will be held in loving remembrance by her pupils and friends, and the impressions that she has made will certainly remain with many. Her life was short but earnest, and when her mission was ended she was ready and willing to go to the better land when she saw Jesus coming to meet her. Her prayers on her sick bed for herself, parents, brothers, sister and the church were most fervent and never to be forgotten. Although unconscious during the last days her death was peaceful.

The funeral took place from the Dayton Lutheran church, Revs. Stark and Christenson preaching the sermons. A very large number of friends and acquaintances were in attendance to pay their last respects to the dead and to express their sympathy for the bereaved family.

She leaves to mourn her parents, three brothers, one sister and hosts of dear friends.

Gustavus Adolphus College.

Till oss har nått den ledsamma underrättelsen, att miss Selma A. Seashore med döden afgick i sitt föräldrahem i Dayton, Iowa, den 20 augusti och begrafdes den 22 i sitt 26:te lefnadsår. Miss Seashore inskrefs vid Gustavus Adolphus hösten 1886 och fortsattesina studier i tre år eller till våren 1889. Sedan dess har hon varit sysselsatt med att hålla dels församlingskola, dels publik skola med stor framgång. Hon var en ung kvinna, som med hela sin själsstyrka egnade sig åt det hon hade för händer. Rikt utrustad både på hufvudets och hjertats vägnar, var hon både Guds och människors älskling. Åt Gud hade hon gifvit sitt hjerta helt. Hon var en af de få af våra forna studerande, som ungefärligen hvartannat år infan sig till våra commencement-högtidligheter. Hon var vårt prisbref inom Iowa-konferensen. Från hennes familj hafva 4 syskon och tvenne kusiner bevistat vår skola. Tre hafva tagit afgangsexamen, flera vistas här än.

Hon är dock ej död, hon hvilar blott. En kär helsning till familjen Seashore i Dayton, Iowa. Vi känna med er saknad efter Selma. Frid öfver hennes minne!
